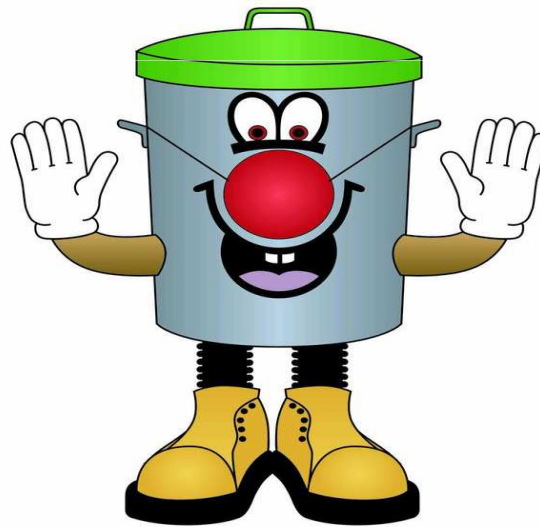


Changes to Household Waste and Recycling



Current Statistics

- 37,000 tonnes pa **domestic waste**:
 - 11,000 tonnes recycled or reused
 - 26,000 tonnes to landfill
- **Recycling** currently around 30%
Expecting over 50% following the new scheme changes



July 2016

- New contractor Ubico - a not for profit local authority company
- Shareholder together with CBC,CDC,TBC, FoD,WODC,GCC
- Future potential for trade waste



August - October 2016

- Delivery of refuse wheelie bins, food bins/caddies
- Communications on scheme changes



November Scheme Changes

- New **fortnightly** rounds and collection days (60% day change)
- New refuse wheelie bins - equivalent to 3 sacks per fortnight (beige sacks for narrow access)
- New **weekly** food waste collections



New Food Waste Recycling

- All food cooked or raw food, bones, teabags/coffee grounds
- Can use plastic bags/newspaper to line the food bins
- Typically over 30% of your current rubbish is food waste
- Food waste is composted in an anaerobic digester and turned into electricity and fertiliser



Increased recycling helps the environment

- Recycled plastics/glass/cans make footballs, drink cans, garden furniture, clothing and plastic bottles
- Recycled paper/card/cartons make food cartons, envelopes, writing paper, newspapers and cardboard tubes
- Less residual waste to landfill
